**O**ne way to prepare for Shabbat is to give tzeddakah. Before Total Shabbat you can bring items for infants, young children and their mothers to Religious School office or the Synagogue office. The Mitzvah Crib is an annual project of the West End Synagogue Social Action Committee to collect needed gifts for mothers and children at Renewal House, who are building lives after suffering the devastating effects of addiction. Special requests this year include maternity and newborn clothing and supplies. Business and casual clothing, especially in large women's sizes, is needed. Both children and mothers are in need of warm gloves and mittens, caps and scarves. Teddy bears as gifts to newly arrived children are welcome. Gift certificates for groceries and to discount stores are always needed. Please be aware that we cannot accept items such as food or medicine past their expiration dates. Items in new or like-new condition are preferred. We are collecting only until January 31<sup>st</sup>.
